Sustainability Forums

The NZSSES are planning to hold quarterly forums, aimed at exploring different engineering and science sectors, and their approach to sustainability. It is hoped that problems with understanding and implementing sustainability principles will be identified and discussed, from which the NZSSES will aim to facilitate research projects to further explore the issues and provide feedback to its members.

Topics so far this year (2005/2006):

- o Local Government and Sustainability (June, 2005)
- o Industry and Sustainability (September 2005)

Our two forums to date have provided a venue for discussion of issues surrounding sustainability. In future workshops and forums, we hope to address issues raised in the forums, to help develop practical ways of improving the uptake of sustainability principles.

Third Forum (May 2006):

o Consultants and Sustainability (Auckland and Christchurch)

What do clients want, and are consultants giving it to them?

- Whose responsibility is it to drive for a sustainable outcome?
- What sort of skills and expertise are needed? is 'sustainability' a specialist area?
- Who do we have to work with? Dealing with wider project teams.
- Should consultants consider sustainability as part of what they do, or as an 'added extra'?
- Is thinking outside the square really practical?
- Do we practice what we preach?

Our third forum is open to all involved in the consulting industry, either as clients or consultants, and involves a number of clients giving their views on the above questions, followed by a facilitated panel discussion.
